Rebirth of an Indispensable Resource

The "Union Catalogue Database of Japanese Texts" ("Kokusho Database") is the newly-inaugurated search portal for the world's largest database of premodern Japanese texts, merging the functionalities of earlier portals "Union Catalogue of Early Japanese Books" and "Database of Pre-modern Japanese Works".

*Subsequently, the Union Catalogue of Early Japanese Books in Europe (July 2023) and the Bibliographic and Image Database of Japanese Modern Times (April 2024) were integrated.

"Premodern Japanese texts" refers in general to Japanese books up to the end of the Edo Period.

Until recently, getting access to the knowledge bound up in premodern texts was no easy matter. Now, however, through the Union Catalogue Database of Japanese Texts, a large number of such texts are freely available in high-resolution digital images for use by anyone, anytime, anywhere.

We make such content available in this fashion with the hope that it will prove useful, not only to researchers in Japanese literature and other fields, but also to a wide spectrum of the general public, including students, educators, and people from the world of industry.

Point 1 Easy to find

In addition to basic searches by title or keyword, there are a number of other available search options to choose from, including searches by image tag, full text searches, searches by recommended keywords, and searches of our featured contents.





Point 2 Easy to Cite

Through the association of our images with international identifiers known as DOI (Digital Object Identifiers), we secure for them a permanency of access that makes them easier to cite.





Point 3 Easy to Use

Our images of premodern texts are displayed in a reader designed to meet the digital archive standard IIIF (International Image Interoperability Framework), thereby facilitating the smooth sharing or reuse of images between different digital archives.





Basic Search Method

If you know the title or author of the premodern text you want, you can conduct a search from the top page by selecting the appropriate search target from among the available choices.




Advanced Search

Using the "Advanced Search" function efficiently will make it possible to find the materials you want more quickly.

How to Read the
"Detailed Bibliographic
Record View" Page

This view provides in a single page (1) the image viewer, (2) the text's "bibliographical data," and also (3) "work data" for the text in question.



Bibliographic Data and Work Data






Other Search Methods

Some materials on the database can be searched by image tags (keywords or headings associated with an image), or by words to be found within the body of their texts.


What if you want to know more about the character " 紫の上 " from the work " 源氏物語 ", and wonder what kind of images of her there are?

Click on the "Search Images" button.



What if you have read the " きりつぼ " chapter of the work " 源氏物語 ", and want to know more about that chapter in the larger context of the work?

Click on the "Search Text" button.



- 1. Type "紫の上" in the search bar.
- 2. Click on the search button.
- 3. Click on the number of the frame containing the image you want to see.





How To Use Images

The classical text images currently available can be used for purposes beyond personal viewing and reading.

What if one wishes not only to merely view or read premodern texts, but also to actually use them in reports for school, etc., or to modify them for usage in posters? In such cases, please review the given item's "license" information (i.e., terms of usage) in the section so labelled onscreen.

Broadly speaking, these terms of usage fall into one of three types (see below). A link to the terms of usage for a particular item will be displayed in its "license" entry, which can be found below the image viewer. The credit display text can be copied to the clipboard.





Images designated as "Public Domain" can be freely used for any purpose, whether commercial or non-commercial, and regardless of whether they are modified or not. This includes using the image for publication or other purposes. We kindly request your cooperation in providing proper credit when reusing the materials.
